I am not sure if I have ever thought that much about the importance of life saving organ recovery. I looked at my driver's license and realize that I had not subscribed for it when obtaining my license. However, after listening to **Ashley Moore**, from Life Link of Florida, and **Jim Lavery**, an organ recipient, I now understand just how important missing that step might be for one the 123,000 individuals waiting for an organ transplant. Only about 15% of those who have pledged to donate will actually be selected. The keys are not just to be dead, but brain-dead in a hospital, and matching a donor to a prospective recipient is no easy task. The organ needs to be one of proper size and from the right blood type that will not be rejected by the recipient and most organs are only useful for a maximum of 48 hours. Twenty-two (22) people die every day from the lack of an organ transplant. We now know what we can do to prevent this, thanks to our speakers.
