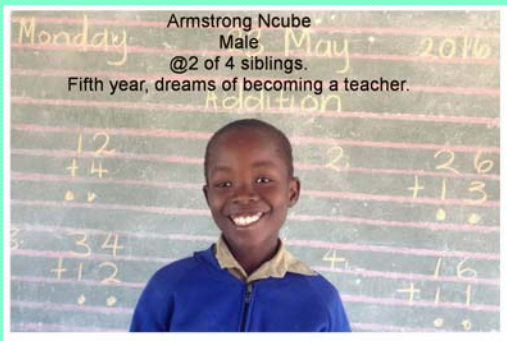
PREVIOUS MEETING *By Ron Rayevich*

While I was certainly well aware of the activities of the **United Way Suncoast**, where **Mireya Eavey** was recently named President, I had not heard of **Career Edge Funders Collaborative**, where she also serves as Executive Director. Career Edge Funders' mission is to enhance workforce development by helping low wage/low skilled workers in our area advance to substantially higher paying jobs. The organization has raised over \$6 million to support employers' efforts to train entry level workers for higher paying jobs by rapidly improving their technical skill levels. To date over 3100 employees have benefited from the efforts of Career Edge Funders. Now the organization is helping this same group of individuals by developing interpersonal and communications skills so vital in career advancement. Mireya indicated that she has plans to improve the fund raising capabilities of United Way Suncoast and its outreach into Sarasota County by building on her favorable past experiences at Career Edge Funders.



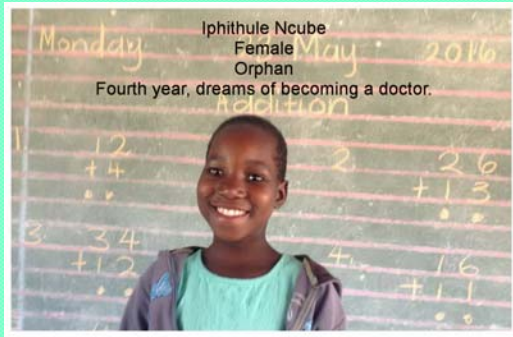
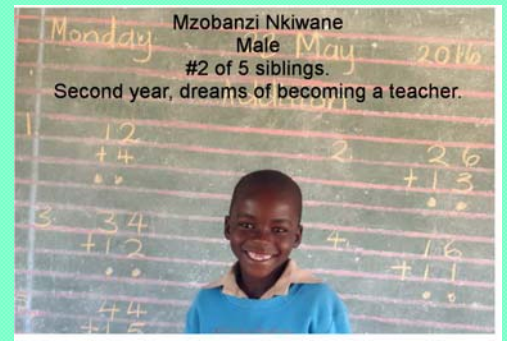

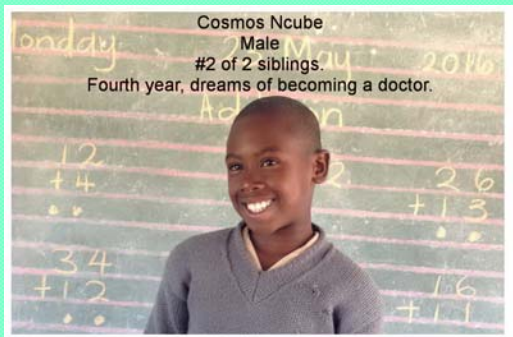


SILENT SUPPORTERS
