LAST MEETING U.S. Representative Vern Buchanan

"Is Washington dysfunctional?" Yes, said our speaker, because there is too much focus on the next election instead of on the issues the country faces. Florida is represented by 27 House members and two Senators. Some of the issues Representative Buchanan is working on include citrus greening for crop survival, veterans' benefits, bills to help the mentally ill including veterans.
